

# **BC Graduation Program**

BC's Graduation Program will continue to require all students to successfully complete 80 credits in grades 10, 11, and 12, and write three provincial assessments: Grade 10 Literacy, Grade 10 Numeracy and Grade 12 Literacy assessments.

There will be an opportunity for students to re-write the Provincial Graduation Assessments to improve their achievement level. Until graduation, students may write a Provincial Graduation Assessment up to three times: the original attempt and two re-writes.

• Post-Secondary schools require the completion of at least six grade 12 courses of which five should be approved academic courses.

# STUDY BLOCKS & SERVICE BLOCKS

- Students are required to be enrolled in at least 6 four credit courses at STA in their senior year.
- Grade 12 students may elect to have a study block.
  - Category A off campus
  - Category B only on campus (library)
  - Category C designated CLC 12 online completion
- Students can also apply for a **School & Community Service Block.** Selection is based on student experience and teacher need.







# CREATE A LIST OF IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

• Unique programs or opportunities — Cooperative education, undergraduate research, combined studies, cohort programs, etc.

• Class size – Contact with instructor and classmates.

• Culture of university, college or institute, city, and distance from supports.

Religious, athletic, and extracurricular activities.



Consider starting at a smaller postsecondary school and benefit from much smaller classes, focus on teaching (not research), similar environment, lower admission requirements, university transfer or full degree options, with a highly specialized and diversity of programs.

# **KEY MESSAGES TO STUDENTS**

• Universities will look at your grades in nearly ALL your academic Gr.11 and Gr.12 courses.

 Particular attention to courses related to what you want to study at university. If you have the course at both the Gr.11 and Gr.12 level, more emphasis will be placed on the Gr.12 grade.

• Be aware that having the highest grades is not the only way to get in – challenging yourself by taking more courses or more rigorous courses can also be beneficial.

## CORE ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT

- ✓ All grade 11 and 12 courses within subject categories related to the degree you apply to at UBC
- ✓ When a student presents both the grade 11 and grade 12 course of the same subject → more focus on the grade 12 course mark

#### CONSIDERATIONS WHEN PLANNING GRADE 11 and 12

- ✓ UBC recommends 6 grade 12 level classes, academic and/or non-academic to demonstrate course load. (English 12 + 5) This is separate from all other transcript assessments.
- ✓ Research subject categories
  applicable to the degree & campus
  to which you plan to apply
- ✓ Research the degree-specific course requirements applicable to the degree & campus to which you plan to apply

Create a **broad plan with back up** – never assume anything — you, your grades, your finances, your interests – lots and lots of things will change by the time you are finishing grade 12.






