### **Grade 8 Parents, please note the following:**

Our 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Grade 8 Science Fair will take place 8:00 am to 9:00 am: Students set up their Science in our school gym on Monday, January 28.

The students' Science Fair Reports are due in Science class on Tuesday, December 18 (day 1) and Wednesday, December 19 (day 2).

The students' science fair boards will be distributed in December and are due in the gym at 8:00 am on the day of the Science Fair.



The students' schedule for the day will run as follows:

Fair boards in the gymnasium.

(This will likely take only a few minutes, but boards MUST be set up no later than 9:00 am.)

9:00 am to 12:00: Students return home to prepare for their interviews in the afternoon. Other students will be writing exams and we will not have supervision for the grade 8s during this window of time.

12:00 to 2:00 pm: Students stand by their Science Fair boards in the gymnasium for judges' interviews. It is essential that students are on time for their interviews – 12:00 sharp!

5:00 pm to 6:00 pm: Students and their families attend the awards ceremony. (Awards will be presented at 5:30 pm.)

e are still in need of judges for our Science Fair! Judges are required from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm on Monday, January 28. Training for judges will be provided on the day of the event, as will lunch! 

#### One Story, One Song by Richard Wagamese

#### The Boys in the Boat by Daniel James Brown

Tells the story of the University of Washington's 1936 eight-oar crew and their epic quest for an Olympic gold medal - a team that transformed the sport and

grabbed the attention of millions of Americans. The sons of loggers, shipyard workers, and farmers, the boys defeated elite rivals first from eastern and British universities and finally the German crew rowing for Adolf Hitler in the Olympic Games in Berlin, 1936. The emotional heart of the story lies with one rower, Joe Rantz, a teenager without family or prospects, who rows not for glory, but to regain his shattered self -regard and to find a place he can call home. The crew is assembled by an enigmatic coach and mentored by a visionary, eccentric British boat builder, but it is their trust in each other that makes them a victorious team. They remind the country of what can be done when everyone quite literally pulls together--a perfect melding of commitment, determination, and optimism.
