How many students will be allowed in a school at a time?

School density targets have been established to ensure the number of students in a school at any one time is safe and manageable.

- These targets have been reviewed by the Office of the Provincial Health Officer and align with public health and safety protocols established by BC Centre for Disease Control.

What will the time schedule look like for each day?

The daily time schedule will remain the same as it has been for the past 2 months.

- In keeping with the social distancing directives, we ask that the students don't come too early to school and leave the school grounds and go home once they are dismissed at the end of the day.

Will a portable computer be required for classes upon return?

Starting in September, at STA, we will be requiring students to bring their own portable computing device with a keyboard.

- A cell phone will not suffice.
- Students who do not have a laptop to use at school for the next 2 weeks, may sign out one at the library and use it for the day.
- At the end of the day, the computer must be returned to the library where it can be sanitized for someone to borrow the next day

What do I need to bring to school when I return this week?

As you may have seen in the video, you will need to bring a backpack or book bag to collect your belongings and empty your locker and take the contents and lock home.

- All students are returning in school uniform.
- You will need to bring your textbooks, team uniforms, library books and any other things you might have borrowed from STA over the course of the year.
- Bring a lunch and some snacks (kitchen is closed).
- Bring your own writing utensils and paper (no sharing).

What do I do when I arrive at school?

Please enter through the front doors on Level 3 or the east side door and upon entering, please sanitize your hands.

- Please observe physical distancing at all times.
- Please keep to the right on the stairs and through doors.
- The stairs in the Science Wing are now one direction (up or down).
- Please wash your hands before and after eating.
- Water filler stations in service; drinking fountains out of service.
- Please return all textbooks to your teachers when you have their class.
- If you are late, check in the office and get a late slip like usual.
