Grad Requirements STA Policy



- ▶ Students are required to take all graduation requirements for the respective year at STA unless the course has already been successfully completed elsewhere (usually at summer school or online during the summer or in a previous term).
- ▶ Students must pass Christian Education 12 in order to participate in all Graduation Activities in June.
- ▶ Drop Deadline for Courses: Sept 25, 2020

Study Blocks & Service Blocks

- ▶ Students are required to be enrolled in at least 6 - four credit courses at STA in their senior year.
- ▶ Grade 12 students may elect to have a study block.
 - ▶ Category A – off campus
(honour roll or effort honour roll)
 - ▶ Category B – only on campus
(library)
- ▶ Students can also apply for a **School & Community Service Block**. Selection is based on student experience and teacher need.

Online Courses



- ▶ STA recommendation is to take all required courses here at STA
- ▶ Students who do not have a required course completed by Fall admission, will be required to take the course at STA
- ▶ For UBC admissions requirement, online courses must be 100% completed by the end of January to be accepted.

Course Offerings



▶ **Academic Courses**

- ▶ Courses from approved lists (differs by university) used to calculate post-secondary admission averages
- ▶ i.e. Chemistry 12, Calculus 12, Economics 12

▶ **Advanced Placement Courses**

- ▶ Offered at the grade 12 level in English, Calculus, Physics and Computer Science
- ▶ Can earn first year university credits in high school
- ▶ May be used for admissions averages

▶ **Electives**

- ▶ Fulfill the Arts Education / Applied Design Requirement
- ▶ Languages

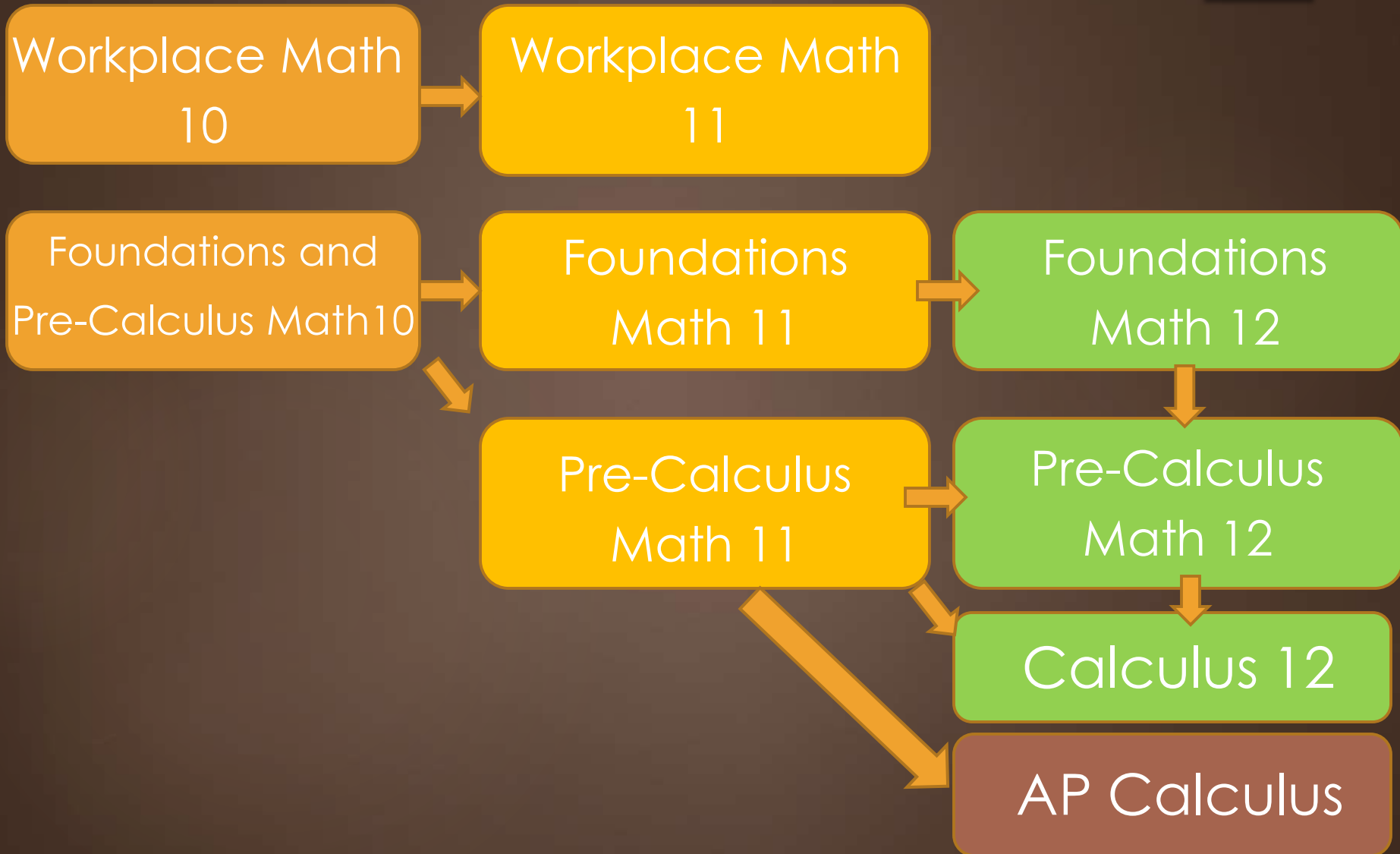

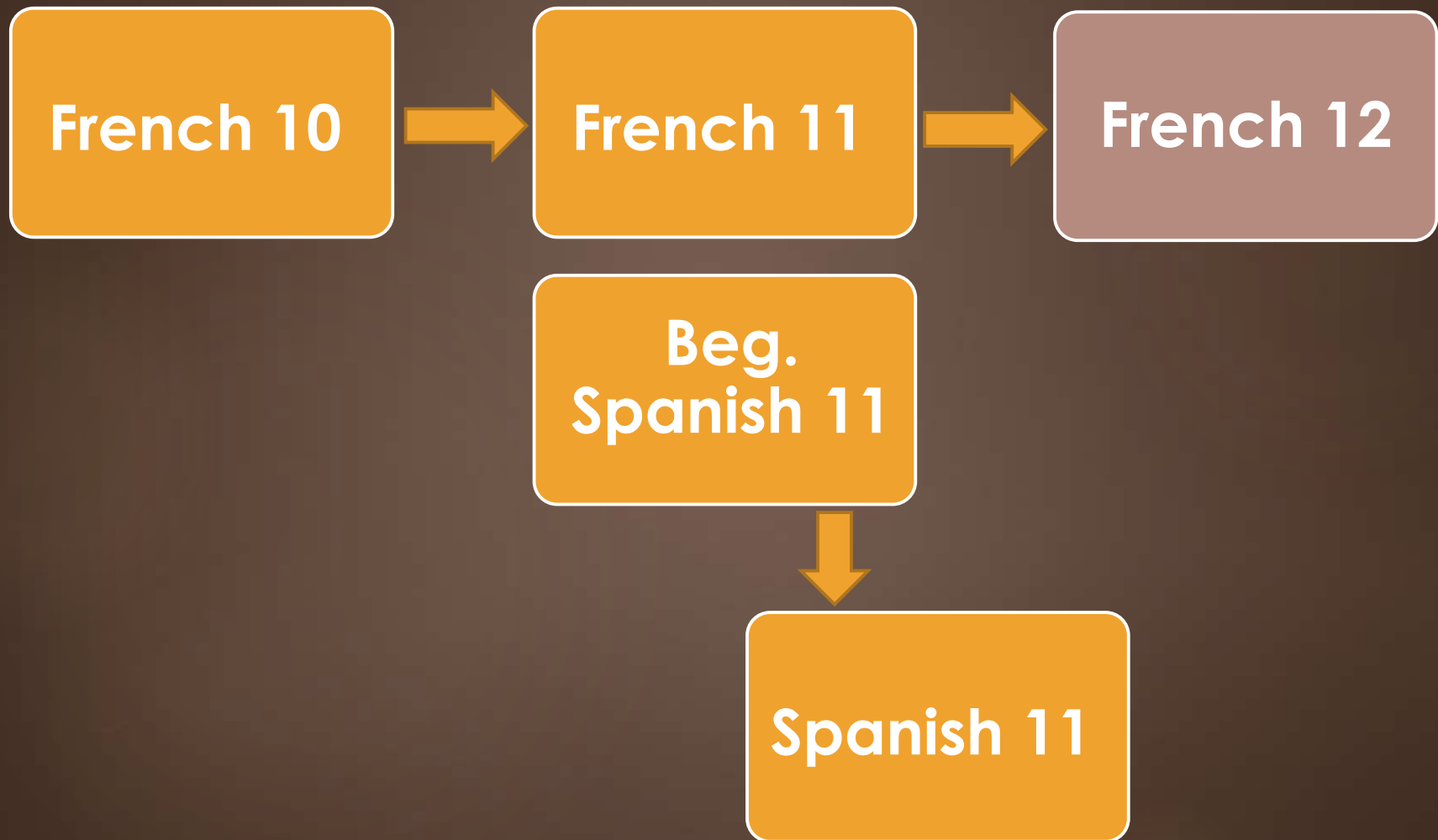

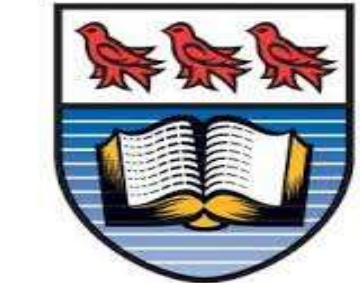

The Right Way to Choose a College

What students do at college matters much more than where they go. The key is engagement, inside the classroom and out.



CREATE A LIST OF IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- **Unique programs or opportunities** – Cooperative education, undergraduate research, combined studies, cohort programs, etc.
- **Class size** – Contact with instructor and classmates.
- **Culture** of university, college or institute, city, and **distance** from supports.
- **Religious, athletic, and extracurricular activities.**

Consider starting at a smaller post-secondary school and benefit from much smaller classes, focus on teaching (not research), similar environment, lower admission requirements, university transfer or full degree options, with a highly specialized and diversity of programs.

KEY MESSAGES TO STUDENTS



- ▶ You should take courses in secondary school that are related to what you want to study at the post-secondary level. Doing so will increase your chances of admission.
- ▶ Universities will look at your grades in nearly ALL your academic Gr.11 and Gr.12 courses.
- ▶ Particular attention to courses related to what you want to study at university. If you have the course at both the Gr.11 and Gr.12 level, more emphasis will be placed on the Gr.12 grade.
- ▶ Be aware that having the highest grades is not the only way to get in – challenging yourself by taking more courses or more rigorous courses can also be beneficial.

Create a **broad plan with back up** – never assume anything – you, your grades, your finances, your interests – lots and lots of things will change by the time you are finishing grade 12.
