It was around late 2011 when the first \$100 banknote was issued. Then followed by 50, 20, 10 and finally 5. I think this polymer-made currency is practically the best thing invented by the government. First of all, plastic money lasts around 2 to 5 years, much longer than paper and they are much more complicated to counterfeit. They hold a number of security features like difficult-to-copy transparent windows, hidden

numbers, metallic holograms, and text printed in a minuscule font.

Plastic bills also stay cleaner and it's harder to become filthy unlike paper money, because of the non-porous surface that does not absorb any perspiration, body oils, or liquids.
