## STA COURSE SELECTION 2018

Parents and students are strongly encouraged to attend STA's course selection information evenings which will take place in the gym on April 18 and 19 at 7:00 PM. The April $18^{\text {th }}$ session will be the grade 11 course selection presentation for all current grade 10 parents and students, followed by the grade 12 course selection presentation for all current grade 11 parents and students on April $19^{\text {th }}$. With many BC universities currently in the process of changing their criteria for admissions, both parent and student attendance at these sessions would be most beneficial. Course selection will be available online for all students the following week from April 24-27 ${ }^{\text {th }}$.

## BC MINISTRY AND EXTERNAL SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

## BC Achievement Scholarships

BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province. The Ministry will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy 2004 Graduation Program requirements, including elective courses. Grad Transitions will not be included. A cumulative average percentage will be calculated and form the basis for determining winners, who receive a $\$ 1250$ scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. Students do not apply for this scholarship.

## DOGWOOD DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIPS

There are 5500 District/Authority Scholarships distributed across school districts and independent school authorities that recognize graduating B.C. students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength. Winners will receive a $\$ 1250$ scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. These award acknowledge academics but also recognize a student's accomplishments in a number of fields:

Indigenous Languages and Culture, demonstrated at school or in the community
Fine Arts such as Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music
Applied Skills such as Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics
Physical Activity such as Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education
International Languages with Integrated Resource Packages (IRPs) or External Assessments, including A.P. and I.B. courses
Community Service (Volunteer Activity), which includes demonstration of local and global issues and cultural awareness
Technical and Trades Training such as Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training
Students can apply for this scholarship through the academic advisor's office.
