

STA LIBRARY



While you do not need to have a background in science to be a wonderful science fair judge, this would certainly be an asset. Training for judges will be provided on the day of the event. SHAD Applications are Now Being Accepted!

SHAD is an internationally recognized, immersive summer program of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math)-based lectures, workshops, projects and activities. Students currently in grades 10 through 12 who are high-achievers in science are encouraged to apply for this month-long summer program at one of 16 university campuses across Canada (including all provinces except Manitoba). While at SHAD, students are encouraged to "recognize their own capabilities and envision their extraordinary potential as tomorrow's leaders and change makers" (www.shad.ca). Attending SHAD has the potential to be a life-changing experience, and it looks great on university and scholarship applications, identifying attendees as elite students. It is also a very fun program, with lots of social activities. STA has sent many students to SHAD over the years, and they have all come back raving about this wonderful program. This past summer our students were placed at McGill University and Mount Allison University.

Online applications are due November 19. The admission process is competitive and takes into account both academics and extra-curricular activities. There is no cost to apply, and if necessary, financial support is available for successful candidates.

Laura Cunningham, grade 10, represented St. Thomas Aguinas High School at the Canada-Wide Science Fair (CWSF) in 2017 and brought home a Junior Bronze Medal. After competing at the CWSF, Laura worked with editors from the new-minted Canadian Science Fair Journal and learned how to transition her science fair project into a peer-reviewed scientific publication. Of the 47

projects submitted for the inaugural at: https://www.csfjournal.com/vol issue of this journal, Laura's was one of just 17 chosen for publication. Grade 8 Science Fair competitors take note: If your project is awarded a medal at the Greater Vancouver Regional Science Fair and the Canada-Wide Science Fair, your work might also one day be published in the Canadian Science Fair Journal. Career Education Department

Career Education is a new provincial curriculum that focuses solely on the competencies and curricular content required for career development. As Career Education is an evolving process of inquiry and self-exploration, the new curriculum is now structured within a framework that recognizes three major elements of development – Awareness, Exploration, and Experience. Students will transition through each element based on their own personal development and community context.

CAREER EDUCATION 8 AND 9

Students reflect on, self-assess, and set goals in personal competency development and determine their strengths and preferences as they explore career-life concepts such as identity, leadership, personal planning, and transferable skills. Students are introduced to increasingly diverse experiential learning opportunities and ways in which family, mentors, and community networks support their continued career-life development.



CAREER LIFE EDUCATION

Students focus on gaining a clear understanding of career-life development knowledge, skills, and strategies for life's journey into adulthood, and includes:

- exploring career-life possibilities for adult life, such as roles, opportunities, and community resources
- examining ways to publicly represent ourselves both face-to-face and in digital environments
- practicing inclusive and respectful interactions for various community and work-related contexts
- connecting and engaging with supportive community members
- researching post-graduation options and planning resources, such as labour market trends, budgeting tools, and workplace safety guidelines.

CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS

Student focus on applying personal career-life management knowledge, skills, and strategies to the one's own personal life journey, and includes:

- deepening career-life concepts and thoughtful self-knowledge to inform personal life-long learning choices and post-graduation plans
- using self-advocacy and employment marketing strategies, such as creating one's own effective public profiles
- employing developed social capital, such as leadership and collaboration skills, to cultivate community networks
- engaging in a substantive experiential learning opportunity of 30 hours or more that is intended to expand and/or deepen student exposure to career-life possibilities, such as service learning, volunteerism, employment, fieldwork projects, entrepreneurship, and passion projects
- designing, assembling, and presenting a capstone to an audience, celebrating the learning journey and next steps toward preferred futures.

LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAMS

Students who have a first language other than English or have studied in a language other than English up to grade 8, might be interested in obtaining credit for their language by taking the Delta School District Language Challenge Exam. All universities in Canada accept the Language Challenge exam marks. UBC accepts Challenge credits for pre-requisite and requirements for courses and second -language requirements but does not accept Challenge marks as part of the GPA calculation for admission. It is highly recommended that you check with your

intended university for their admissions requirements. The deadline for applications to the 2018/2019 Language Challenge Exams is *November 2, 2018*. 
